

## GORDON WILSON WILL BE FEDERAL CANDIDATE

Will Resign His Provincial Seat  
and Contest Wentworth  
Against W. O. Sealey.

HAMILTON, Aug. 6.—(Special.)—Gordon Wilson, M.L.A. for North Wentworth, will contest Wentworth County seat in the federal parliament with W. O. Sealey, the present Liberal member. The Conservative nomination was offered to Mr. Wilson last week, but he was not then in a position either to accept or decline the offer.

On Saturday, however, he had an interview with Sir James Whitney in regard to resigning his seat in the provincial assembly, and to-day stated to The World that he had decided to make the race against Mr. Sealey.

Mr. Wilson is very popular in the Wentworth constituency. He is personally acquainted with every voter in the riding, is a fine canvasser, and an excellent public speaker. It is confidently expected by his friends that he will win out.
