CROOK CASSIDY TRIES TO ESCAPE

Notorious Jail-Breaker Again Within Ace of Freedom.

Frank P. Clements, alias Cassidy, notorious crook and jail-breaker, arrested Saturday night in Hamilton, Ontario, and taken to custody in the Milton County Jail, yesterday afternoon. Clements has a lengthy record both in the United States and Canada, and is noted for his ability to escape from prison. When identified in Hamilton, where he was working as a guard at the Hamilton Asylum, Clements was handed over to Chief Constable L. J. Smith of Burlington, Ont., and arraigned in court Monday morning when he was remanded in the Milton jail for trial.
