In the Dining-Room.

WEDNESDAY, Jan. 12.

BREAKFAST—Hominy flakes. Pork tenderloin. Fried potatoes. Hot waffles. Maple syrup. Coffee.

LUNCHEON—Slices of cold meat. French toast. Spice cake. Plum jam. Tea.

DINNER—Potato soup. Sheep's brains, roasted. Piquant sauce. Stuffed potatoes. Lettuce. Polish tartlets. Coffee.

Cut out these recipes and paste them in a scrap-book.

Waffles—Mix one pint of sifted flour with two-thirds of a pint of milk. Add a smooth paste; beat in a tablespoonful of melted butter and a little salt, and lastly two eggs beaten light. Have waffle iron hot and ready greased, pour in enough batter to cover the lower side and close the upper one gently down upon it. Keep over five half a minute and turn over for same length of time. Remove and place in oven a few moments to crisp.

Sheep's Brains, Roasted—Slightly boil four sheep's brains; throw into cold water and dry whole; brush them over with oil and roll in highly seasoned bread crumbs; use pepper, salt and nutmeg. Place each one on a slice of bacon in a pan and put in a well-heated oven; when nicely browned take up and place on slices of toast and serve with piquant sauce.

Piquant Sauce—Cook two tablespoonfuls of onions in four of vinegar for three minutes; then add a large cupful of stock, a teaspoonful of sugar, one-fourth that quantity of cayenne and salt to taste. Boil for five minutes, put in two tablespoonfuls of chopped capers and some of chopped cucumber pickles. Boil up and serve.

Polish Tartlets—Roll good pie crust out thin and cut it into two and a half inch squares; brush each square over with the white of an egg, then fold over the corners so they will meet in the middle; slightly press together, brush over with the white of egg, sift with sugar and bake in a quick oven for quarter of an hour. When done make a little hole in the middle and fill with jam, jelly or marmalade.

THE TURF.

WIRE TAPPERS AT WORK. Chicago, Jan. 11.—The foreign book-makers at the Race track were hit hard on Saturday. One firm lost \$2,000 on the first race at New Orleans, and goodly sums on other races. Other firms were also big losers. Suspicion was excited that something was wrong, and in the afternoon a range of three men was discovered around a telephone instrument in a barn near South Chicago. All three were arrested, and a wire from the Roby line into the barn. It is thought they netted several thousand dollars.

THE FUTURITY.

New York, Jan. 11.—Nine hundred and twenty-three nominations for the Futurity of 1900 have been received by the Coney Island Jockey Club, and a few more may arrive by mail within the next day or so. With any exception this is the largest number of nominations ever received, the exception being the Futurity of 1885, which had 1,010.

DEATH OF DR. TREMAINE.

Buffalo, Jan. 11.—Dr. William S. Tremaine, one of this city's best-known physicians, died at his home on Elmwood avenue on Sunday night. Dr. Tremaine was born on Prince Edward Island, Canada, in 1832. He was an enthusiastic sportsman, and at the time of his death was managing director of the Fort Erie Jockey Club.

WHEEL.

A general demand for larger gears is expected next season. Last season there was a run on gears of about 72. According to many manufacturers, high gears, running from 80 to 104, will be the only thing this year. In very few cases of big orders are gears of less than 80 called for. It is not believed that for general use any gearing of more than 72 will be used except by the scorching set, but only those higher than 72 will be considered up to date.

BOXING TABOOED.

San Francisco, Jan. 11.—The health and police committee of the board of supervisors has decided to allow no more boxing permits, which means the end of prize-fighting in this city. This decision was reached at the committee on Saturday night, and as a further blow at the "sports," the committee also considered an ordinance absolutely prohibiting pool selling within the city and county. The ordinance, if it is passed, will absolutely prohibit the placing of bets upon racing or selling pools at any place within the city or county, even within the fence of the race track.

Murder in Toronto.

A Woman Mortally Wounded by Her Husband.

An Outsider Hurt in Attempting to Part the Pair.

Toronto, Ont., Jan. 11.—Lizzie Thomas, aged about 30, a light mulatto, was fatally shot by her husband on York street last evening. Her husband, Alfred Thomas, was until two years ago, a Pullman car conductor on the G. T. R., and being discharged, has since then lived by a revolver. His wife secured a legal separation from him a year ago. Last evening he was out for a walk with her. They were on York street, and he had some conversation about furniture, of which Mrs. Thomas was in possession. Thomas wanted to sell it for drink. His wife was ironing as she talked, and as she turned to take a new shirt, she was shot in the back by a flat-iron. The ball entering her abdomen. The woman started to run, but was held back by her husband. The second bullet entered her body near the first. She then ran upstairs and down by a back door to the rear of the house, where her husband again met her. She tried to climb over the fence, but being unable to do this, turned and grappled with her husband, and succeeded in getting the weapon from him. She then ran out on to the street and into an adjoining drug store, flourishing the revolver, and shouting that she had been shot. The proprietor thought the woman was drunk, and put her out on the street. Here her husband again met her, and a second struggle for the revolver occurred.

Gen. Jamieson, who happened to be standing near by, thought the woman was the assailant, and started to take the weapon away from her. He succeeded in getting it away from her, but not without causing it to explode, as it was lowered, and he received a dangerous wound in the thigh. The police then appeared on the scene. Thomas was arrested, and the woman and Jamieson taken to St. Michael's Hospital. The woman's wounds were dressed. One bullet was taken out in the leg, but the other remained in the body, and cannot be extracted. She is expected to die. Jamieson was advised to stay in the hospital, but refused to do so, and there is some danger of blood poisoning setting in as his case.
