Reeve Brown of Shelburne advocated that before the public were allowed an opportunity to invest money in the local coal venture the government should send up a diamond drill and officially set at rest a thirty-year-old story as to the presence of coal in and around Shelburne.

The Hqn. H. Mills, minister of mines, has compromised on this idea and yesterday announced that Fuel Controller H. H.
