WHAT BEER AND WINES MEAN
The Electorate Must Not Regard the Above in the Nature of a Compromise— If It Comes, Prohibition Goes— How to Mark the Ballot Saturday.

Probably the most important feature of Saturday's election to keep in mind is the significance of the light wine and beer question, and what it means if the majority vote for it. Those who want prohibition in the province and dominion, and believe the present prohibitory law preferable to returning to drink legislation must realize that if everyone voted for prohibition, and if a majority of the referendum is lost—prohibition in the province gone, and that we return in a measure, three years ago, from which it took many years to escape. The only safe way is to vote in favor of prohibition and against light wines and beers by making a cross in the first and last spaces of the ballot.
