CUDDLE WINS THE KENTUCKY HANDICAP

J. K. L. Ross' Horse Captures Tuff Event, One-Fifth of Second Over Track Record

Louisville, June 2—Carrying top weight, 182 pounds, J. K. L. Ross' Broomstick-Eugene Burch colt, Cuddie, ridden by Jockey Lyke, and the favorite in the betting, won the sixth running of the Kentucky handicap at Douglas Park on Saturday in handy fashion.

A length back, R. L. Baker & Company's imported colt Hollister fought it out for second money with Pif Jr. getting the decision by a narrow margin. A length and a half behind Hollister, Arriet, E. W. Moore's imported mare, led the remainder of the field.

The race was at a mile and a quarter for three year olds and was won in 3:12, 000 to the winner, \$1,500 to the second horse, \$800 to the third and \$400 to the fourth.

The time for the race, 2:03, was within one-fifth of a second of the track record for Douglas Park, made by Luke McLuke.

ADD TO YOUR YEARS.
(Dr. W. A. Evans, in Chicago Tribune.)
Every soldier in camp drills now in the forenoon, spends some time in setting up exercises, and does a few hours of manual labor, mostly in the open air.

Every medical officer is required to spend an hour a day in drill, and setting up exercises. This period follows the breakfast hour. At its expiration the medical officers go to their hospital and dressing station duties.

The health of the men in camps is materially better than that of the civilian population. Men who slouched and stooped six months ago are now fine, rugged, straight, broad shouldered, supple jointed fellows.

If it is possible for military men to gain so much in a few months, why should civilians stay on their unsatisfactory health level? If the army life makes for freedom from coughs and colds, and if coughs, colds and pneumonia do great harm, should not the civilian population adopt those habits which make the soldiers so nearly immune?

If half an hour a day of deep breathing exercises, chest expansion exercises, abdominal muscles exercises, and bending exercises is good for the medical corps, some of whom are over fifty years old, why would they not be good for all men and women who are in good health, but who are soft, stiff, and short winded? If hours of work and drill in the open air will make a soldier into a good man, why not follow the same policy for the civilian?
