## PUBLIC NOTICE

The attention of Builders and Others is called to the following section of the Act of Assembly 41 Victoria, Chapter 87, which will hereafter be strictly enforced:

"No building shall be erected hereafter in any part of the City of Saint John, without a permit being first obtained from the Inspector of Buildings, and no addition or alteration to any building, subject to the regulations of this Act, shall be made without a permit from the said Inspector."

Any person violating the provisions of the aforesaid section is liable to a penalty of not less than twenty dollars and not more than one hundred dollars.
