Pekin, China, Feb. 29—A revolt has broken out among a portion of Yuan Shi Kai's troops, some hundreds of whom started a riot this evening. They wrecked and set fire to several houses and paraded the streets, shooting indiscriminately. A strong force of loyal soldiers is endeavoring to restore order.

The streets are crowded and the greatest alarm prevails among the inhabitants.
