Princess Clementine of Belgium, now the wife of the Bonapartist pretender, Prince Victor Napoleon, is spending the money which she inherited from her father, King Leopold, despite his testamentary dispositions and his wishes, in a manner calculated to make him turn in horror and anger in his grave. Not content with giving to the Paris "Autorite," the financial backing which it so sadly needed—it was until a few weeks ago the only Bonapartist organ in France—she has now purchased the Paris morning "Eclair," and the evening "Patrie," paying for the former 1,500,000 francs.


