CONQUERORS OF LOCAL BASKETBALL STARS LEAVE FOR COAST

Commercial Bowling Tournament Starts Tonight on Imperial Alleys

RIDEAUS START ON LONG TRIP SEEKING TITLE

Journey Takes Them From Coast To Coast

The Rideau basketball team of Ottawa, champions of the Eastern Section, will play the Vancouver five in Vancouver on April 28 and 30 for the national Dominion championship, according to an announcement issued jointly by President Race of the Canadian Basketball Association and by the British Columbia Basketball Association. The team is now en route West and will stop off in Winnipeg for an exhibition game. Another exhibition is planned for Edmonton on the way to the coast.

A Long Journey. When the Rideaus complete their trip to Vancouver, they will have completed one of the longest journeys in quest of an amateur championship ever made in Canada. In winning the Eastern championship, the Ottawa quintette was forced to travel to the Atlantic Coast, playing the final in Saint John, so that when they arrive in Vancouver they will have traveled completely across the continent, in addition to the mileage covered from Ottawa to Saint John.

Expenses Are Heavy. Basketball critics throughout the Dominion are singing the praises of the Rideau team in the determined bid for a national title, for in addition to the time consumed in travel, it is also probable that the players will be forced to bear some of the expenses themselves. Under provisions made by the basketball authorities, the Rideaus will receive expenses for four days in Vancouver, but this arrangement still left some \$400 short, which had to be raised by the players. By staging exhibition games in Ottawa most of this amount has been covered.

Are Young Teams. Should the Rideaus succeed in winning the Dominion title, they will have the distinction of being one of the youngest teams to gain this honor. Most of the players, still in their teens and none has yet attained his majority. For all of their youth, however, the Ottawa players are showing themselves to be remarkably steady under fire and a well-drilled and speedy aggregation. The team is captained by A. Charbonneau, and the other players on the squad are Don Young, Lyle Lashley, Syd Cook, Ed Goodwin, Eric Kilpatrick, Eric Nicol and Jack Jameson.

Victor McAuley of Nova Scotia was seventh and Silas McLellan of Hants County, N. S. finished eleventh. McAuley's time was 3 hours, 42 mins., 8 sec.
