## TRUSTEES' REPORT.

In presenting the Annual Report for 1889, the Board of Trustees express their gratitude to God for His continued blessings on their labours during the year. They wish also to thank every member and adherent for enabling the Board to present such a successful financial statement. It will be observed that the principal source of revenue, the weekly offerings and collections, amount for the year to \$5,018 01, showing an increase of \$355.78 over that of 1888, and \$2,129.58 over the year 1887. The Board would also express thanks to the Ladies' Aid Society for the handsome sum of \$468 63, which has enabled them to pay off \$1,000 of the Church debt. It was hoped at the commencement of the year that the collections and offerings would average \$100 per Sabbath, and the actual average of \$96.50 shows how near it has come to our expectations. These figures are very encouraging indeed, and with our ever increasing membership, we expect that in presenting the Report for 1890 we will be able to show a proportionate financial increase.

We have entered upon a new year with an advanced list of 260 contributors, and it is hoped each one will give their contributions regularly, and in the envelopes provided. Quite a number have been putting their contributions in the general collection. While the Church thus receives the same benefit, the books of the treasurer show the contributors to be in arrears, and it is hoped this will be remedied in 1890.
