To the Honourable the Superior Court of the said District.

I, the undersigned, Henry Irwin, Provincial Land Surveyor, duly sworn in and for the said Province and residing in the City of Montreal in the said District; the Surveyor appointed in this cause in accordance with the terms of an Interlocutory Judgment rendered on the fifth day of April last past, ordering that a preliminary survey of the properties in question in this cause be made by a sworn Land Surveyor, and that said Land Surveyor make a figurative Plan of said properties, indicate the respective pretensions of the parties, examine the evidence and documents and plans and titles already of record in this cause, take such further evidence as may be adduced before him and upon the whole report; and also in accordance with the terms of a further Judgment rendered on the nineteenth day of May last past nominating me to act as said Land Surveyor, copies of both of which judgments are hereto annexed; have the honour to report:

That after having been sworn, as appears by the Oath hereto annexed; and after having duly notified the Plaintiff and Defendant through their respective Counsel, as appears by the notice hereto attached; I did repair to the Properties in question in this cause situate on the North East side of Brun-wick street in the said City, on the thirty first (31st) day of May last past, for the express purpose of hearing such further evidence as might be adduced before me, and of making a preliminary survey of the said properties.

Where being I met the Plaintiff, Mr George Roberts, and Mr W. F. Ritchie, Counsel for the Defendant, who stated to me their respective pretensions, went over the said properties with me, shewed me the various division fences and walls of the same and the partition between the sheds occupied by the parties.
