## OBITUARY.

**Thomas G. Simms.**

 Hartland, Oct. 29.—One of Hart-  
 land's prominent citizens in the per-  
 son of Thos. G. Simms, passed away  
 on Sunday morning after a severe ill-  
 ness of heart trouble and Bright's  
 disease. He had been in ill health  
 for more than a year, and for the last  
 two months had been confined to his  
 bed. He was forty-five years of age.  
 Mr. Simms was a son of the late  
 Webster Simms, and was born at  
 Knowltonville, Carlton county. He  
 came to Hartland about eighteen  
 years ago, and for the last nine or  
 ten years conducted a fruit and con-  
 fectionery business, which for many  
 years he was the efficient and faith-  
 ful commissioner of the town water  
 works department, surrendering the  
 care of which only a few months ago  
 when ill health made it impossible  
 for him to further attend to its duties.  
 He was a consistent member of  
 the United Baptist church, and in  
 politics a staunch Conservative.  
 Possessed of a kindly and genial dis-  
 position he had many friends who will  
 sorely mourn his passing. Beside his  
 stricken wife he is survived by  
 two sons, Gr. Curtis, doing his bit  
 "Somewhere in France" and Vernon,  
 of the local team of Montreal staff;  
 also by three brothers, James R., of  
 Bath; George W., of Knowltonville,  
 and Robert L., of Woodstock, and one  
 sister, Mrs. Gascogne, resident in  
 the west.

The funeral was held privately yester-  
 day afternoon from his late resi-  
 dence on Main street, and was con-  
 ducted by the Rev. E. A. Trites,  
 pastor of the United Baptist church.  
 At the grave the services were in  
 charge of the Knights of Pythias, of  
 which the deceased was a member.

**Louis Clarke.**

 noon.


**Mrs. John Peters.**
