THE WATERING OF FARM HORSES

Walter Moore, a well-known writer, says:—
"It is a common thing for farmers to work their horses in the hayfield from morning to night, watering them only at noon. This is done even on days of excessive heat. The driver usually has a bucket of water in the middle of the morning, and again in the afternoon; but the horses, who are equally as thirsty, go only drinking, but it causes the horse to drink to excess at noon and again at night, which often results in colic, and always tends to produce a distended stomach, or what farmers call a 'hay belly.' Farmers who would treat their horses humanely should take water into the field for them in hot weather."
