TO CONFER ON WORLD FINANCE

League of Nations' Secret Plans International Meeting Sept. 24.

PRESIDING OFFICER WILL BE

Delegates from Each to be Statesman, Finance and An Economist.

ACKERMAN (Copyright, 1920, by Public Ledger, London, Sept. 9.—Although governments have been in agreement on the amount of reparations Germany should pay under the terms of the Versailles treaty, the League of Nations secretariat is today developing its plan for the first financial conference in Brussels, Sept. 24.

Believing that economic reconstruction of the world is an essential United States aim, it is to the world, regardless of membership in the league, Europe is very desirous that America be represented.

This conference which was first held in July and was postponed because of the failure of the armistice conference at Spa to agree on the amount of reparations, will be held in Brussels, Sept. 24 to Sept. 28. It will be the first of a series of international financial conferences which have been held since the war.
