REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON ORANGE MUTUAL BENEFIT SOCIETY.

The Report of the Committee on the Orange Mutual Benefit Society was presented and read by W. Bro. Dr. Oronhyatekha.

To the Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Ontario West:

We, the Committee on the Orange Mutual Benefit Society, beg leave to report as follows:

We recommend that the Constitution be amended,

1. By striking out Sec. 2, Art. 3.
2. By striking out the assessment rate in Sec. 1, Art. 9, from 51 years of age to 60, inclusive.
3. By striking out Sec. 2, Art. 9.
4. That Sec. 1, Art. 13, be amended so as to read, "A Medical Officer shall be nominated by the District Master, for each District, upon the request of a Master of a Primary Lodge, or the Agent for such District; and in case that the District Master has not so appointed, or where it may be necessary that additional examiners are required, the agent shall have all the powers of the District Master in so appointing a Medical Officer or Officers; such appointment or appointments shall be subject to the approval of the President; and, whenever possible or advisable, be a member in good standing of the Loyal Orange Association. He shall in all cases be a regularly qualified practitioner."

5. That the clause, "who are under 50 years of age," in Sec. 1, Art. 8, be amended so as to read "not more than 50 years of age at his last birthday;" and that the clause in the same section, "except as provided for in this Constitution" be struck out.

6. That the Annual Report and Laws of the Association be amended that 500 members be required for the Constitution of this Association the Primary.
