the committee in charge and it is confidently expected that the members of our club will give a good account of themselves.

The Indoor Rifle and Revolver Club is looking forward to a good year. The new range is excellently equipped for improving marksmanship. Many members of the Division will take advantage of the facilities afforded them and at present quite a few are getting good practice.

Reg. No. 11004, Const. A. W. F. Milrose, has been honoured by being made a "Shodan" (1st Dan), a degree in the Art of Jiu-Jitsu. He had the acting rank of this degree in November, 1935, which is now confirmed. The degree was conferred on him by Dr. Jiguro Kano of Tokyo, Japan. Practically the only white men in Canada holding this rank are members of our Force, who studied at the same time as Const. Milrose in Vancouver at the Barracks and the Kidokwan, 1932-35.

"K" Division

On August 13th, His Excellency the Governor-General of Canada officiated at the unveiling of the Cenotaph in Edmonton, a wreath from all Members of "K" Division being laid on the Cenotaph by Asst./Commissioner H. M. Newson. In the evening on the same date a reception, attended by the officers of the Force in Edmonton, was held at the Parliament Buildings in honour of His Excellency.

During the early part of September, His Excellency visited Lake Louise, Banff, Calgary, Lethbridge, Medicine Hat and other southern points in the Province of Alberta.

On September 1st, 1936, at the barracks, Edmonton, the following trophies and medals won by members of "K" Division during 1935 in connection with the Revolver Shooting Competitions were presented by the Lieut.-Governor of Alberta, the Honourable W. L. Walsh;

- 1—R.C.M.P. Revolver Championship sponsored by Dominion Marksmen:—Cup and Medals presented to "K" Division team, composed of Sergeant A. Ford, Sergeant D. Forsland, Corporal D. Mighall and Constables H. R. Warren and R. J. Blair, with a score of 1391 x 1500. "C" Division, Montreal, was second with a score of 1370.
- 2—Open Dominion Revolver Championship. This was also won by the same "K" Division team, in competition against Montreal City Police, the final scores amounting to 1403 x 1500 against 1394.
- 3—The Duke of Connaught Cup was won by Constable Walker, who made the highest score in the Force during the regular R.C.M.P. Annual Shoot. Two other members tied for this event in the first instance, all scoring a possible 240 \times 240, but in the shoot-off, Constable Walker made 238 \times 240 and won the event.
- 4—The Colonel Bryan trophy, which is awarded to the highest individual score in "K" Division during the annual R.C.M.P. shoot was also won by Const. Walker. As Const. Walker is stationed in the Peace River district, Sergeant Major Wilson accepted the cups on his behalf.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, W. L. Walsh, having relinquished his appointment as Lieutenant-Governor of Alberta on September 30th, Lieut.-Colonel P. C. H. Primrose, ex-Superintendent of the R.C.M. Police, took office as his successor on October 1st, the ceremony being performed at the Parliament Buildings in the presence of a large gathering.
