

INTERCOLONIAL RAILWAY.

The Commissioners appointed to construct the Intercolonial Rallway give Public Notice that having annulled the Contracts for Sections Nos. 5, 6 and 7, they are prepared to receive Tenders for ro-letting the same.

Section No. 5 is in the Province of Quebec, and extends from the Easterly end of Section No. 2, forty miles east of Riviere du Loup, to the Sixtysixth mile post, near Rimouski, a distance of about 20 miles.

Section No. 6 is in the Province of New Brunswick, and extends from the Easterly end of Section No. 3, opposite Dalhousie, to the West side of the main Post Road, near the Forty-eighth mile post, Easterly from Jacquet River, a distance of about 21 miles.

Section No. 7 is in the Province of Nova Scotia, and extends from the Southerly end of Section 4, near River Philip, to Station O, (formerly Station Fifty.) at Folly Lake, a distance of about 21 miles. The Contracts for the above Sections to be completely finished and ready for haying the track by

Section No. 17 will be in the Province of Quebec, and will extend from the Easterly end of Section No. 11, down the Mutapedia Valley, to Station No. 83, about one mile above the boundary line between the Countles of Rimouski and Bonaventure, a distance of about 20 miles.

Section No. 18, will be in the Province of Quebec, and will extend from the Easterly end of Section No. 17, down the Matapedia Valley to Station No. 380, near Clark's Brook, a distance of about 20 miles.

Section_No. 119, will extend from the Easterly end of Section No 18, in the Province of Quebec, down the Matapedia Valley to its mouth, and thence across the River Restigouche te Station No. 370, at the Westerly end of Section No. 3, in the Province of New Brunswick, a distance of about Minites, including the bridge over the River Restigouche.

Section No 29, will be in the Province of New Brunswick, and will extend from the Easterly end of Section No. 19, In the Town of Newcastle. on the Chaplin Island road, thence crossing the South West and South West, branches of the liver Miramichi, and terminating at Station No. 24 about one mile and three-quarters South of the South West branch, a distance of about six miles, including the bridges over the branches of the River Miramichi.

The Contracts for Sections, Nos., 17, 18, 19 and 20, to be completely finished and ready for taying the track by the first day of July, 1872.

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INTERCOLONIAL RAHLWAY.

MIR Commissioners appointed to construct the Intercolonial Railway give Public Notice that they are now prepared to receive tenders for four farther Sections of the Line.

Section No. B will be in the Province of Quebee, and will extend from the Easterly end of Section No. 8 to Section 901 near Malfait Lake, about 203 miles in length.

Section No. 11 will be in the Province of Quebee, and will extend from the Easterly end of Section No. 13, to Station 523, a point between the mouth of the River Amqui and the little M. tapedla Lake, about 22] miles in length, Section No. 15 will be in the Province of New

Brunswick, and will extend from the Easterly end of Section No. 9 to Station No. 6.9, a point fully half a mile Easterly from the crossing of the River Nepissignit-in length twelve onetenth miles.

Section No. 13 will be in the Province of New Brunswick, and will extend from the Easterly end of Section No. 15, to the Westerly end of Section No. 10, about 18, mites in length.

Section No. 3 is in the Province of New Bruns. wick, and extends from Section No. 270 about two miles South of the Restigouche River to Station No. 199, about 2,000 feet South of Eel River, near Dalhousie, being a distance of about 21 miles.

Section No. 148 in the Province of Nova Scotia, and extends from Station No. 220, on the Amberst Ridge, to Station 0, on the Ridge about a mile North of the River Pauly, a distance of about 27 miles.
