

THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL.

His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir JOHN YOUNG, Baronet, of Bailieborough Castle, County Cavan, Ireland, P. C., G. C. B., G. C. M. G. B. at Bombay, 31 August, 1807. Ed. at Eton, and Corpus Christi College, Oxford, where he graduated B.A., 1829. Called to the Bar at Lincoln's Inn, 1834. M., 8 April, 1835, Adelaide-Annabella, dau. of the late Marchioness of Headfort, by her first husband, Edward Tuite Dalton, Esquire. Succeeded his father, the late Lieut. Col. Sir Wm. Young, as second baronet, 10 March, 1848. Is a magistrate and deputy-lieutenant for county of Cavan. Was formerly M. P. for Cavan in British House of Commons; and successively one of the junior Lords of the Treasury, from 1841 to 1844, and Joint-Secretary of the Treasury, from latter date to 1846, in Sir Robert Peel's Administration; Chief Secretary for Ireland, from 1852 to 1855, in Lord Aberdeen's Administration; Lord High Commissioner of the Ionian Islands, from latter date to 1859; and Governor of New South Wales from Jany., 1861, to Dec., 1867. Appointed Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada, 10 Nov., 1868.
