BILL

To regulate the Landing Place, at the Market in the Lower Town of the City of Quebec, and for other purposes.

Preamble.

HEREAS it is expedient for the public convenience of the Citizens of Quebec, and for the Inhabitants frequenting the Markets thereof, with produce from the South side of the River St. Lawrence that the place commonly called and known by the name of the Landing-place in the Lower Town of the City of Quebec, should not in future be obstructed by boats or vessels, loaded with firewood, wood or timber of any description, or hay, and that the said Landing-place should be put under better regulations than heretofore it hath been; Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An "Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed "in the fourteenth year of His late Majesty's "Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more " effectual provision for the Government of the " Province of Quebec in North America;" and " to make further provision for the Government "of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this Act, no more than one vessel shall at any one time be permitted to lie in the said place commonly called and known by the name of the Landing-place, along side of the wharf, commonly called the Queen's Wharf, actually belonging to John William Woolsey, on the South side of the said Landing place, nor shall any more than one vessel be permitted to lie at any one time in the said Landingplace, along side of the wharf, commonly called St. Andrew's Wharf, belonging to James McCallum, on the North side of the said Landingplace, such vessels not to exceed in burthen one hundred and fifty tons register measurement, each, under the penalty and forfeiture of

No more than one vessel, not exceeding 150 dons, to be on each side of the Landingplace.
