C A P. XXVI.

An Act for allowing until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and ten, the Importation of certain Fish from Parts of the Coast of His Majesty's North American Colonies; and for granting a Bounty thereon.

[30th March 1809.]

HEREAS it is deemed reasonable and proper that the Encouragement given to the Fisheries carried on from the Island of Newfoundland, and Coast of Labrador, by an Act passed in the Forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for 47 G. 3. allowing until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and eight, Sess. 1. c. 24. the Importation of certain Fish from Newfoundland, and the Coast of Labrador, and for granting a Bounty thereon, which has been continued by an Act of the Forty-eighth Year of His present Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and ten, should be extended to the Fisheries carried on by the Inhabitants of certain of His Majesty's Colonies on the Continent of North America; be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act, SaltedSalmon any Salted or Pickled Salmon, or Salted Dry Cod Fish, having been taken or Cod and cured at the Coast of the Gulf of Saint Lawrence, the Coast of the cured at St. Lawrence, &c.
