

Athlone Fellowship Awarded

Two University of New Brunswick Engineering students have been awarded an Athlone Fellowship tenable for post-graduate study in the United Kingdom.

The successful students are David Ross Peebles of Montreal and Neil Charles Macey MacLean of Chalk River, Ontario.

Mr. Peebles, a fifth-year student in civil engineering, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. David Peebles of Montreal. He received his early education in that city at Kensington School and Lower Canada College, from which he graduated in June 1964. He is presently completing requirements for a Bachelor of Science in Engineering in the transportations and soils option.

While at UNB he has maintained his interest in target shooting and skiing and is a member of the Engineering Undergraduate Society. During his summer vacations he was employ-

ed with the Canadian National Railways.

Mr. MacLean, a fifth-year student in electrical engineering, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Donald W. MacLean of Chalk River, Ontario. A native of Ottawa, he received his early education in schools of that

city. He is presently completing requirements for a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering. He is writing a thesis on "Adaptation of Network Analysis (Topological) Program from IBM 1620 to IBM 360".

While at UNB he has been active in junior varsity football, the ski club, intramural sports and Model Parliament. During his summer vacations he worked for Ontario Hydro.

The Athlone Fellowships are graduate awards given annually by Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom to enable Canadian engineering students to take post-graduate training in Great Britain.

The fellowships are in two groups: 31 are available for graduates on completion of a bachelor's or higher degree; ten are available to engineers who have already spent some time in industry.

They provide for a period of two years in the United King-

dom and are awarded on the understanding that their holders afterwards return to Canada to follow their careers. They are available for any among the following options but the preference of the awarding authorities is for courses involving works experiences.

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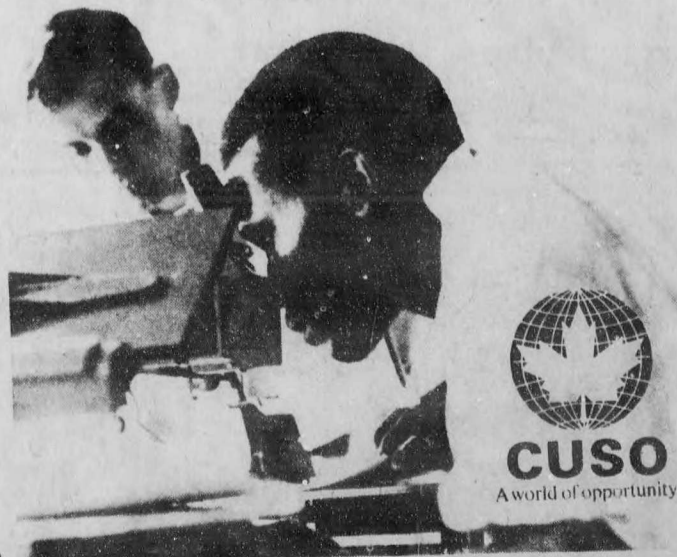
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
