Having said this, may I now say that I believe  
the method or methods taken by my right honourable friend

that the course he has adopted has been wrong from the  
outset. He has been in the wrong by pursuing the methods  
he has, and, being in the wrong, he has worked, and is  
continuing to work and irreparable injury to our country  
and, in particular, to the friendly relations which should  
exist in matters of trade, as in all else, between Canada  
and Great Britain.

Substantiation of this Statement:-

(1) Reference to Attitude of Parties in Past.

Let me now proceed to substantiate what I have  
just said. To do so it will be necessary to go back to  
the attitude of the respective parties in this House at  
the last session of the last parliament, - to the attitude  
taken toward the problem by the government then in office,  
and the attitude taken by my right honourable friend as the  
then Leader of the Opposition, an attitude which, may I say
