

Shortly after her annuity money for 1908 was forwarded by Agent H. Nichel to be funded. A cheque in release of this amount, \$5.00, was issued on the 26th August.

Wr Nichols attention was drawn to the fact that when an Indian does not propose to continue funding his or her annuity money for a reasonable length of time it should not be sent in to be funded.
