

In further reference to your letter of the 12th
 ultimo, regarding the Joseph family, I beg to say that the
 Department is informed by the local Superintendent that Mrs.
 Joseph is the sole heir to a small estate on the Nominato
 reserve, left by her father, which is valued at from \$150 to
 \$200, provided a sale could be effected.

This Department has a fund from which relief is
 provided for indigent Indians. Should this family be deported,
 and should they be in need, the fact would be reported to the
 Department, and any necessary relief would be furnished.

If any deportation proceedings are taken, will you
 be kind enough to advise the Department as to the time and the
 United States port from which deportation would be made.
