A. On the 21st of September I got up in the morning and a neighbour came ower and wanted me to haul food for his cow. This cow was the one I got the milk for the family from so I thought I had better haul it in. Well, I was hauling food and while doing so I saw the Frovost coming about a quarter of a mile away. I started to walk towards them and they stopped. I said, 'are you looking for me'. They said 'who are you'. I told them.

Q. How were you dressed at that time?

A. In my uniform, sir.

Q. Did they ask any questions?

A. Yes, sir, they asked me if I had my "I" card.

c. What did you tell them?

A. I said yes, sir.

Q. Did you show it to them?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did they ask you anything else?

A. They asked me how long I had been gone. I said around about two months. They said they only got motice three days ago to pick me up.
