A.27. I went to Citadel Hill, Halifax.
- Q.28. And from Citadel Hill?
A.28. Newfoundland.
- Q.29. What unit were you with in Newfoundland?
A.29. The 107th Coast Battery.
- Q.30. How long were you there?
A.30. It would be two years this July.
- Q.31. Did you have any furloughs while in Newfoundland?
A.31. Yes sir, I had one a year ago and a second one in November of last year.
- Q.32. Why did you overstay your last furlough?
A.32. Conditions at home -- I had to stay. I went home and I had work to do
to do. I had to cut wood and there was no one else you could get there
to do the work and I was cutting lumber to get milled this summer to
