FIFTH WITNESS
For the Prosecution

H.13101 Spr. WANFORD, J., No. 1 C.E.R.U., a soldier of the Canadian Army (Overseas), having been duly sworn, states:-

Between 2200 and 2215 hrs 29 Sep 44, I was walking down Minley Road, between the "Crown and Cushion" and the entrance to camp. L/Cpl. Monique and Spr. McKendry were walking with me. We were walking on the right hand side of the road, Spr. McKendry on the extreme right, and L/Cpl. Monique in the centre. There was a group of men walking in the same direction, about 20 - 25 yards ahead of us. Suddenly L/Cpl. Monique said "Look Out", and grabbed me and pulled me toward the ditch. I saw a station wagon go by, and heard a bump after it was a few yards past us. I ran up and saw two soldiers bending over a third soldier lying on the ground. As I saw the station wagon turn in the gate at camp, I ran down to the sentry at the gate and reported the accident.

Q. Did you recognize anyone in the station wagon?
