Dear Sir:

On December 20, 1945, I filed a flight plan from  
Quebec with my destination Baie Comeau.

According to the met. forecast, the winds which  
I was to encounter at cruising height were such that I was able to  
reach Baie Comeau with sufficient fuel reserve. However, the winds  
I did encounter were different and I found that I had to land at  
Forestville.

After landing, I immediately informed the radio  
operator there who said he would inform Quebec of my arrival.

When I left Forestville, December 21st, he also  
stated that he would flight plan me to Seven Islands.

Upon my arrival at Seven Islands, I was very surprised  
to find that he had not done so. Therefore, I immediately instructed  
the Seven Islands radio operator to report me in from Forestville  
to both Mont Joli and Quebec which I am informed was done.

I am quite well aware of Airway Traffic Regulations  
and I shall ensure that such an incident shall not occur in future.

I am taking steps to check up as to why the radio  
operator at Forestville neglected to inform the proper authorities of  
both my arrival and departure.
