

dem apostolicam doctrinam omnes
venerabiles Patres amplexi et sancti
doctores orthodoxi venerati atque
secuti sunt; plenissime scientes, hanc
sancti Petri Sedem ab omni semper
errore illibatam permanere, secundum
Domini Salvatoris nostri divinam pol-
licitationem discipulorum suorum
principi factum; Ego rogavi pro te,
ut non deficit fides tua, et tu aliqui-
ando conversus confirma fratres tuos.

Huc igitur veritatis et fidei num-
quam deficientis charisma Petro ejus-
que in hac Cathedra successoribus di-
vinitus collatum est, ut ex celso suo
munere in omnium salutem fungen-
tur, ut universus Christi gressus per eos
ab erroris venenoosa esca averus,
coelestis doctrinae pabulo nutritur,
ut, sublata schismatis occasione, Ec-
clesia tota una conservaretur, atque
suo fundamento innixa, firma adver-
sus inferi portas consistenteret.

At vero cum hac ipsa estate, qua
salutifera Apostolici munera efficacia
vel maxime requiratur, non pauci
inveniantur, qui illius auctoritati
obtrectant; necessarium omnino esse
censemus, praerogativam, quam unigenitus
Dei Filius cum summo pasto-
rali officio conjungere dignatus est,
solemniiter assercere.

Itaque Nos traditioni a fidei
Christianae exordio perceptae fideliter
inherendo, ad Dei Salvatoris nostri
gloriam, religionis Catholicæ exalta-
tionem et Christianorum populorum
salutem, sacro approbante Concilio,
docemus et divinitus revelatum dogma
esse definitum: Romanum Pontificem,
cum ex Cathedra loquitur, id est, cum
omnium Christianorum pastoris et
doctoris munere fungens pro suprema
sua Apostolica auctoritate doctrinam
de fide vel moribus ab universa
Ecclesia tenendam definit, per assisten-
tiam divinam, ipsi in beato Petro
promissam, ea infallibilitate pollere,

that by his assistance they might in-
violably keep and faithfully expound
the revelation or deposit of faith de-
livered through the Apostles. And,
indeed, all the venerable Fathers have
embraced, and the holy orthodox
doctors have venerated and followed,
their Apostolic doctrine; knowing
most fully that this See of Holy Peter
remains ever free from all blemish of
error according to the divine promise
of the Lord our Saviour made to the
Prince of his disciples: "I have pray-
ed for thee that thy faith fail not, and,
when thou art converted, confirm thy
brethren."

This gift, then, of truth and never-
failing faith was conferred by heaven
upon Peter and his successors in this
chair, that they might perform their
high office for the salvation of all;
that the whole flock of Christ, kept
away by them from the poisonous
food of error, might be nourished with
the pasture of heavenly doctrine; that
the occasion of schism being removed,
the whole Church might be kept one,
and, resting on its foundation, might
stand firm against the gates of hell.

But since in this very age, in which
the salutary efficacy of the Apostolic
office is most of all required, not a
few are found who take away from its
authority, we judge it altogether
necessary solemnly to assert the pre-
rogative which the only-begotten Son
of God vouchsafed to join with the
supreme pastoral office.

Therefore faithfully adhering to
the tradition received from the be-
ginning of the Christian faith, for
the glory of God our Saviour, the exal-
tation of the Catholic religion, and
the salvation of Christian people, the
sacred Council approving, we teach
and define that it is a dogma divinely
revealed: that the Roman Pontiff,
when he speaks *ex cathedra*, that is,
when in discharge of the office of
pastor and doctor of all Christians,
by virtue of his supreme Apostolic
authority, he defines a doctrine re-
garding faith or morals to be held by
the universal Church, by the divine
