## TOWNSHIP OF TILBURY EAST.

This township is bounded north by the Thames; east by Raleigh; west by West Tilbury, and south by Romney. The south-east corner fronts on Lake Erie. There is a fair share of good land in this township. A low, wet prairie, about three miles in breadth, extensively used in grazing, borders on the Thames. Two or three branches of the Thames run through this township.

The first settlers, two or three families from Britain, entered this township in 1833, and were located on lots of one hundred acres each by the Hon Col. Talbot; but little was done in the way of improvement until about the year 1840, when the opening of the "Middle Road" encouraged the settlers to renewed exertion, since which time the township has gradually improved.
