CAP. XIII.

An Act to provide against injuries to the Intervale Banks of the River Saint John. Passed 14th April 1853.

E it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, as follows:—

1. The Commissioners of Roads in the Parishes of Maugerville and Sheffield, Commissioners of in the County of Sunbury, and in the Parishes of Canning, Cambridge, and authorised to ex-Gagetown, in Queen's County, are hereby authorised and required to apply such statute labour s part as they may deem necessary of the statute labour of the inhabitants or pro- of the Biver. prietors of lands in such Parishes respectively, for the purpose of securing and defending the banks of the River Saint John, lying in said Parishes, from wasting away, and for procuring such timber, brushwood, stone, and other materials, as may be found necessary for that purpose.

2. That part of the said statute labour employed in securing the said banks When to be perwhere the public highway in the said Parishes runs, may be performed at such accounted for. time or times in each year as may be most practicable; and the Commissioners returns thereof shall, after the present year, be made on or before the first day of June in each year.

3. Where it may be deemed necessary to apply the statute labour for the purposes of this Act, such statute labour shall be performed by the inhabitants at any time of the year that the Commissioners of Roads may direct for that purpose, under the provisions of the Law relating to Highways, accounts of which shall be rendered by the Surveyors and Commissioners in time to be submitted at the subsequent June Sessions of the Counties respectively, any thing contained in the Act passed in the thirteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act relating to Highways, to the contrary notwithstanding. 13 V.c. 4.
