BRAVE ACT OF CABLE OPERATOR

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. .-Hugh Greggan, an operator for the British Government at the Fanning Island Cable station in the mid-Pacific dived at the risk of his life into the shark infested waters and recovered the lost end of the cable soon after the German cruiser Nurnberg, completed its work of destroying the station, according to R. Gregg devised a glass bottom boat and after cruising around for several days located the lost end in forty feet of water frequented by sharks.
