THE CLOSURE

So the Laurierites propose to fight do they? Well so do the Conservatives and they intend to pass that navy proposal without going to the country.

Don't make any mistake about the fact that in 1882 in the British House, Gladstone found it necessary to introduce a closure and this is how the incident is recorded in Bourinot's "Parliamentary procedure and practice."

"Several references have been made in previous parts of this chapter to the standing orders which have been lately adopted by the House of Commons in England with a view of presenting systematic obstruction to public business and bringing the debates on questions within a reasonable compass."

"When it became evident that there was a settled policy of obstruction in the House and that the old rules were ineffective the Speaker felt constrained to depart from the line of conduct hitherto observed by the chair and to interpose on one occasion when a sitting had been continued for forty-one hours and the house had been frequently occupied with heated discussions,atory motions for adjournment supported only by small minorities in opposition to the general sense of the house. He felt compelled to say after some preliminary observations:-"

"The dignity, the credit, and authority of this House are seriously threatened and it is necessary they should be vindicated. Under the operation of the accursed rules and methods of procedure the legislative powers of the House are paralyzed. A new and exceptional course is imperatively demanded and I am satisfied that shall best carry out the will of the House and may rely upon its support, if I decline to call upon more members to speak and proceed at once to put the question from the chair. I feel assured the House will be prepared to exercise all its powers in relation to these proceedings. The future measures for strengthening orderly debate must leave to the judgment of the House; but I may add that it is necessary either for the House itself to assume more effective control over its debates, or to entrust greater authority to the chair. It is a plain duty for the House Government to adopt a like course. The only thing the Laurierites are hungry for is a chance to get by. They don't give a hang for the dignity of the matter; its only object is to get by."

AS PUT BY THE TIMES

The London Times, by consent, ranks as the greatest newspaper in the world-not in circulation, for many other papers surpass it in that-but in its absolute ness, its employment of highly-abled correspondents in the cap of the world, and in its probity view and not sensationalism. In all countries a Times representative ranks in about the same class a British Ambassador.

Take Canada as an example, addition to a correspondent at Ottawa, they enjoy the services of J. S. Willison of the Toronto News as consulting editor in connection with Dominion affairs.

"An influence unparalleled in the history of journalism is the way the United States encyclopedia rig puts the matter.

These remarks from that paper therefore entitled to great weight. "It cannot be doubted that the Canadian people set themselves to build battlements, they would give their purpose as rapidly as any people in the world who are undertaking the business for the first time. But two consecutive would follow. In the first effective help which they desired to the empire would be delayed for some years. In the end place, the more rapidly succeeded, the more certain would their success be gained the cost of our great shipping establishments here. This is a question of business solely, but succeeded in the more serious question of imperial security whose labor is indispensable already, owing chiefly to tradition rules, too few for the demand and Canada could not embark the building of battlements competing for that already in supply. Would that this promote our common objective strengthening the basis of
