Latest News From the Town - Night School Classes Cancelled.

(From our own Correspondent.) PARIS, April 11--The evening classes in the Central School have been cancelled until the week commencing April 19th, when they will be held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Thursday night the annual meeting of the Baptist church was held, with a large attendance of members. The financial standing of the church was very encouraging in all departments, showing substantial growth, with no liabilities.

Overseer Kay's report of the weather for March was: Maximum temperature 58 degrees; minimum 70 degrees; rain, 4 days; snow 5 days; eclipse of moon March 17th, squirrels seen on the path; crocus bloomed on 17th; robins seen on 20th, and Grand River broke up on March 27th.

HOLIDAY TRAFFIC BREAKS ALL RECORDS

Special Trains on All Lines Are Packed With Week-end Excursionists.

Cheap rates and fine weather made the holiday traffic the heaviest in the records of the railway companies since Christmas. Hundreds of visitors came into the city on every train, the heaviest traffic strain coming on the Toronto trains, which were jammed.

From all points in Western Ontario swarmed the incoming holiday-makers, and there were almost as many strangers among the promenaders on the streets as there were citizens. Extra coaches were added to all the outgoing trains to handle the exceptionally heavy local traffic, and most of the incoming trains were a great deal larger than usual to handle the unprecedented increase. Despite the large crowds, the railroads handled all the trains satisfactorily and kept them close on schedule.


