#### ROAR OF NATURAL GAS

Along the northern part of the entire district to-day. East Tilbury oil district, writes J. R. Munro, in the Globe, there are gas wells of wonderful pressure. When one of these wells is opened and the gas allowed to blow free, and the gas allowed to blow free, it is impossible to talk within a radius of 200 feet on account of the roar. The pressure amounts to about 500 pounds to the square inch. Comparatively few wells have been bored in this gas region, because at present there is no ready market for the product. Manufacturers in Chatham are now obtaining natural gas at ten cents a thousand cubic feet, while customers are also being supplied at Merlin and Tilbury. No farmer in the oil region thinks of burning wood or coal now, and they all have gas connections in their houses. Gas is piped into boilers for drilling purposes and also runs the houses. Gas is piped into boilers for drilling purposes and also runs the gas engines which do the oil pumping. There is at least one instance where the gas forms a small waterworks system.
