The Passion Play Is Described

There was a very large gathering at Canon Wood Hall last evening to hear Rev. Canon Smart, of Heart's Content, deliver a most interesting lecture on the "Passion Play" of Oberammergau.

The lecture "was given under the auspices of the Llewellyn Club and the Rev. E. C. Earp, Rector of St. Thomas's, presided.

The lecture was illustrated with 60 beautifully coloured slides, illustrative of the life of the actors and showing scenes from the Passion Play. Canon Smart told the story of the Passion Play and of the peasant-actors who take part in this world-famed production. In 1633 in gratitude for the cessation of a plague the villagers of Oberammergau made a vow to perform the Passion Play every tenth year, and the vow has been kept. Only on two occasions have they departed from the decennial performance, viz. 1870, when the Franco-Prussian War interrupted and in 1920 when typhus was due to the world, when the actors were not prepared and it is now being played this year. At the last performance over 500 players, all villagers of Oberammergau, took part, and the artistic and dramatic value of the performances was very striking. People travel from all parts of the world to see the production, and the villagers get all their revenue from this source.

The Rev. lecturer was listened to with close attention and at the conclusion a very hearty vote of thanks was accorded.

A feature of the evening was the singing of "The Holy City" by the Rev. Mr. Earp, illustrated by 12 beautiful lantern slides.

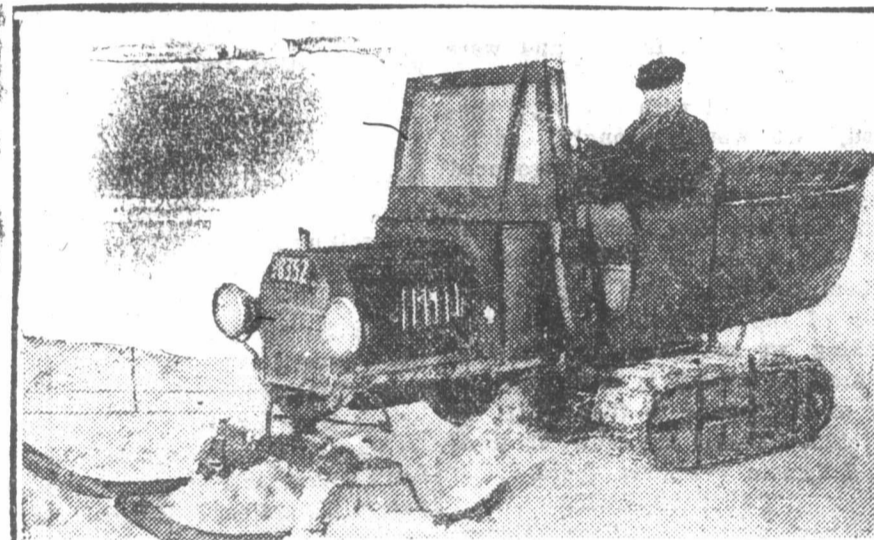
