ATHENS POLICE HAVE NEW MEANS

Of stopping autoists from speeding on public highways. New York, May 28.—A traveler who has returned here from Greece says the policemen of Athens have an effective and rather unusual method of curbing speeding autoists. Officers posted along the principal streets carry planks studded with long sharp nails and when they see a car approaching at a rate they believe is excessive, they drop the plank in front of the machine. If the car is speeding, it can not be stopped in time and as a result the tires are punctured, but if the machine is proceeding at a reasonable pace, it can be stopped before the plank is reached.

The chief of police finds the system is cheaper than maintaining a motorcycle squad and it has the additional advantage of making the capture of speeders comparatively easy.

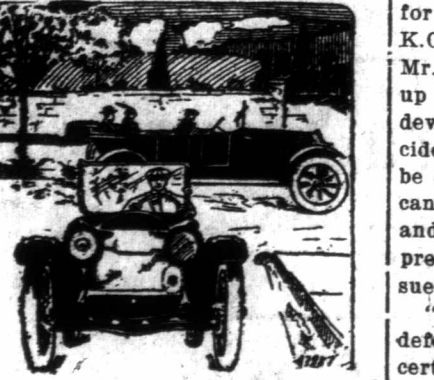

LIQUOR SALES ARE DWINDLING FAST

Victoria, May 28.—British Columbia's official liquor business has been gradually declining since the commencement of the present year, when the importation restriction was removed. While the turnover at the Vancouver store in the month of December last exceeded a quarter of a million dollars, the January sales did not exceed \$145,972.25. These had dropped in February to \$119,693.79; in March to \$127,506.73, and in April to \$92,646.25. Complete returns are not yet available for May; it is considered likely, however, that there will be a proportionate reduction in the amount of liquor sold.

Similar remarks apply to the Victoria store whose total sales for January amounted to \$33,838.00, or a little more than half of the December turnover. In February the figures officially recorded are \$33,838.0000; in March, \$31,738.30, and in April, \$22,467.65.

The following are the returns for Nanaimo, Prince Rupert and Quesset where the Government Agents have authority to vend liquor to druggists and the medical profession:

Nanaimo. January, \$4,275.75; February, \$3,251.35; March, \$4,474.90; April, \$3,457.20. Prince Rupert: January, \$3,070.15; February, \$3,547.15; March, \$3,505.19; April, \$3,729.03. Quesset: March, \$105.00; April \$40.15.

SOME ARTICLES EXEMPT FROM TAX

Ottawa, May 28.—The Department of Inland Revenue has given the following rules in regard to exemptions from the new sales tax: Sauages, fresh only; milk, condensed and evaporated, exempt; milk, powdered, if made from whole milk, exempt; ham and bacon, subject to tax; glucose, exempt; bread, exempt; peas and split peas, exempt; vegetables, exempt, if in natural state; fruits, exempt in natural state; groats, subject to sales tax.

Manufacturers receiving raw materials for further process of manufacture are required to charge sales tax for the amount of their account on returning the goods.

Premiums given in exchange for coupons are considered as sales and the luxury tax must be paid where the articles are taxable.

CROP PROSPECTS ON PRAIRIES BRIGHT

Winnipeg, May 27.—Reports received by the Manitoba Free Press from a number of points in Manitoba Saskatchewan and Alberta show that yesterday's rain was very beneficial to the growing crops and will help materially in restoring crops damaged by the high winds. Many points report that general conditions are very promising. The rain was general west as far as Moose Jaw and Estevan and north to Humboldt.

Numerous places report signs of grasshoppers but state that every preventive measure is being taken. Mixing stations have been established and everything is in readiness to fight the pest.

PREMIER SWEARS STATEMENTS FALSE

Mr. Oliver Denies the Elliott charges under oath and, says they are scandalous.

Victoria, May 28.—Premier Oliver in sworn statements in his affidavit that came out today, most emphatically denies as "false in every detail" the charges brought against him in the famous last-hour telegrams sent to the Legislature by R. T. Elliott, K.C., Dolly Varden counsel.

The affidavit was made in the \$50,000 libel action that the Premier has brought against Mr. Elliott for his attack.

M. B. Jackson, K.C., M.P.P. acting for the Premier, and H. A. Maclean, K.C., for Mr. Elliott, appeared before Mr. Justice Macdonald today, to draw up the order following yesterday's developments whereby the court decided that the Elliott defence must be confined to the facts at issue and cannot bring in sensational outside and irrelevant questions aiming to prejudice the trial and cloud the issues.

"I brought this action against the defendant for damages by reason of certain distinct, explicit and isolated defamatory allegations made by the defendant, charging me with personal grafting and wrongful and wanton acts alleged by the defendant to have been committed by me for the purpose of my making illit and improper money profit or gain, and misconduct on my part in public office for personal profit and gain," states Premier Oliver under oath in his affidavit.
