# **DECLARATION OF** R. L. CALDER, K. C.

Montreal, Oct. 6-"I think the people of Canada might do many more foolish thing than take such action as would let the governmen know that it is the servant of the law and not its master." was the declaration of R.L Calder K.C., Crown Prosecutor in the course of an address delivered here this evening. "Too many peo ple in politics today" he continued "are content to lash the rudder to ahead, right or wrong. The first step in practical politics as I see realize that the ments are masters until they cast their mere servants while their masters do not even try to do what they bound themselves to do.

Calder, were carried on not by kings, but by the civil service, in crats, the permanent officials o the service. He instanced case in which the effect of a statute of King Edward 1-that to sue the Crown for redress wrong was a matter of privilegeutterly discordent with idone of right





Comparatively few of the thousands of miles of railroad organization which does not rely to a greater or lesser extent on electricity as an aid to efficient operation and service. Electricity plays an important part in all of the great Railroad Shops through the country. Some trains and cars are operated by power directly transmitted or stored in batteries. Bridges are operated, and a thousand and one electrical devices are in constant use which beside being labor saving do away with the human element which might make for inefficiency. Numbered among these are the automatic Block Signals which one finds distributed along the line of the Canadian Pacific, and notices particularly in the Rocky Mountain passes where they are more urgently required.

To the average layman an automatic signal is just a signal, and the general public is only interested in it because it gives added protection, or rather eliminates possible danger from the portion of track which it governs. To the railroad official it is more. It acts as watchman against broken rails, open switches, a fouled track or any
