**BRUTAL MURDER OF "WAACS"**

London, May 14.—The attention of the entire country has been attracted to the epidemic of crime around London through the finding early Tuesday of the body of a woman, a member of Queen Mary's Auxiliary Corps, under branches which evidently had been broken from trees to cover traces of the brutal murder, in the woods near Bedford. The slang name for the auxiliary corps is "Waacs," of which there are 40,000 members, they go with the troops to France, doing their mending, operating automobiles and other light work supplementary to the war. The army camp in Haines Park, Bedford, is occupied by the Royal Engineers.

A girl was stabbed to death in the back and was missing four days. Her name is Annie Ruit, a native of Jersey. She was 24 years old, and is the first of the organization to come to grief.

**BOY SCOUTS HANDBOOK.**

At the annual meeting of the Canadian General Council of the Boy Scouts Association on Saturday last, announcement was made of the publication of a new Handbook which has been specially written for the use of the Canadian Scouts.

The new book is by Mr. Gerald H. Brown, of Ottawa, Honorary Dominion Secretary of the Boy Scouts Association, and is based on the system of training contained in "Scouting for Boys" by Sir Robert Baden-Powell, adapted to Canadian conditions and requirements.

The Handbook contains forewords by Sir Robert Baden-Powell, founder and Chief Scout of the Boy Scouts Association, and by His Excellency the Duke of Devonshire, Chief Scout for Canada.

The former in his foreword pays a high tribute to the new book of which he says: "I am delighted with this book. It marshals my ideas with greater clearness and consistency than I could have done myself." His Excellency the Duke of Devonshire writes that "our attention and efforts must forthwith be directed to the permanent maintenance of peace and to the work of reconstruction. By its inception, its principles, and its history, the Boy Scouts movement can be fully trusted to play a notable part in these great objects and the timely publication of the present volume will, I know, be of real and practical assistance as well as of deep interest to all who have its true welfare at heart."

The Handbook for Canada is a volume of close on 700 pages, containing over 500 illustrations which covers every feature of the Scout program including woodcraft, nature, camping, civility, the prevention and treatment of accidents, health and endurance, patriotism and citizenship.
