Rome, August 11.-For the first time since 1870, when the Pope lost Rome, papal ship to-day sails the high seas. Because of its initial mission it is called the Nuncius. It was first chartered to carry Mgr. Vassallo di Torregrossa from Spain to Argentina. He is the new Apostolic Internunsic to the South American Republic.
