Schooner Evelyn Beleived Lost

Capt. Howard of the schooner John W. Miller, who recently arrived in port from Barbados, reports that wreckage was found on May 8th last in latitude 41.19 N., and longitude 56.09 W., which is believed to be the schooner Evelyn, some ninety days out from this port. The captain states that as soon as the derelict was sighted, the crew put off in a dory and discovered that the wreckage composed the port quarter of a large schooner painted white, and bearing on the stern timbers the words "Bridgeton, Barbados" in full, whilst above the broken bulwarks were the letters "E.V." The wreckage was floating in an upright position with a portion of the stern and port bulwarks out of water. Examining the wreckage, more closely it was found that only a section of the poop was attached, whilst the rudder, stern post and after rail were intact. A portion of the rigging was also visible. The particulars as given correspond with that of the schr. Evelyn, which left here on February 26th last, bound to Pernambuco with a cargo of fish. Nothing has been heard of the vessel since then, other than that already told by Capt. Howard. The Evelyn was commanded by Capt. Nielsen with a crew of seven men. Capt. Nielsen also had with him his wife, making eight all told, and it is feared that all have met with a watery grave. The schooner Evelyn was built in 1907 for Job Bros. & Co. She had a gross tonnage of 324, length 142 feet, 30 feet beam, and 12 feet in depth. For a number of years she operated in the fish trade to the European and Brazilian markets. Last year she was taken over by the Monroe Export Co., and was making her first voyage from that arm.
