Optimistic Feeling in Washington Relative to the Chinese Situation—Further Fighting Between Russians and Chinese.

Vienna, Oct. 3.—The admiralty has received the following dispatch from Taku: "In accordance with the request of Count Von Waldersee the seizure of Shan Hai Kuan was decided upon by a council of the admirals Sept. 29, and all was prepared for action.

Washington, Oct. 3.—A feeling of buoyant optimism prevails among officials here today relative to the Chinese troubles that warrants the belief in the existence of a sound foundation, based on recent developments, in pending negotiations.
