At an early hour this morning William R. Hearst left his headquarters in the Hoffman House for his residence, following a conference with his campaign managers and the heads of the Municipal League Ownership ticket, Mr. Hearst himself would make no statement, and referred all questioners to Max F. Ihmsen. The latter said that Mr. Hearst claimed his election as mayor by a good majority. That a fraudulent vote of at least 40,000 had been cast in Greater New York was the claim of the Hearst manager. He had decided, Mr. Ihmsen said, to demand a recount of the entire ticket, if after the 194 missing ballot boxes had been located and counted, it was found Mr. Hearst still lacked sufficient votes to elect him.
