To make raw beef sandwiches, buy a half pound of good round steak (government stamped); lay it on a clean board and with a silver knife scrape the beef pulp away from the tough connecting tissues, first on one side of the steak and then on the other until you have got all you can. Spread the pulp on thin buttered slices of bread; sprinkle with sait and pepper, cover with other thin buttered slices, and serve fresh and cold.

For raw beef balls prepare the pulp as above, season, shape very lightly into balls, and pan broll, that is, heat an iron pan very hot, drop the balls on it, sear them quickly on both side and serve at once on small rounds of buttered toast.


