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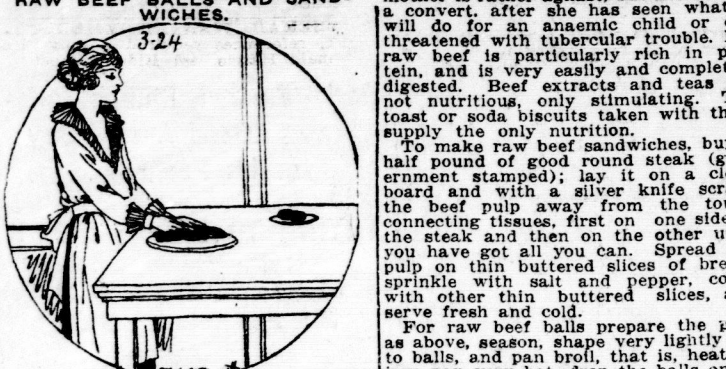

"Feed him up," the doctor says, when a child has recovered from an illness, but not in full health, give him fresh eggs, good milk and butter, and raw beef. At the idea of raw beef the mother is rather aghast, but she is soon to learn that it is a very good thing to do for an anemic child or one threatened with tubercular trouble. For raw beef is particularly rich in iron, and is very easily and completely digested. Beef extracts and teas are not nutritious, only stimulating. The toast or soda biscuits taken with them supply the only nutrition.

To make raw beef sandwiches, buy a half pound of good round steak (government stamped), lay it on a board and with a silver knife scrape the beef pulp away from the tough connecting tissues, first on one side, then on the other until you have got all the pulp. Spread the pulp, buttered slices of bread, sprinkle with salt and pepper, cover with other thin buttered slices, and so on.

For raw beef balls prepare the pulp as above, season, shape very lightly into balls, dip in hot oil, then in an iron pan very hot, drop the balls on it, sear them quickly on both sides and serve at once on small rounds of buttered toast.

Personal Health Service

Are Peanuts Food? The vitamin which is essential for growth. Wheat flour bread does not furnish the essential vitamin. The peanut is rich in protein material, containing about twice as much as flour does and larger proportions than even beefsteak or eggs. Moreover the protein of peanut has been found to possess high physiological value; that is, it is of such structure as the body can most readily utilize for repair processes and building—not in the sense of growing fat merely. U. S. Government experts in testing the nutritive value of peanut flour, found that a bread made with one-fourth peanut flour and three-fourths white flour furnished adequate protein material for the normal growth of young animals.

Children are young animals. Any child old enough to eat bread may be given peanuts as a regular or at least a frequent part of the diet, not as a treat.

Mind, I do not say that peanut flour is preferable to wheat flour, or that peanuts can displace wheat in our diet. I do say that a bread made with four parts peanut flour is superior in a nutritive way to the white flour bread most people eat, though not superior to real staff of life made from flour that has not been robbed of its vitamins and its mineral elements in the process of milling.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS. Exercise for Eye Strain.

Please give your opinion on— exercise for the cure of weak eyes and eye strain. (D. H. M.)

ANSWER—Practically every civilized individual has eyestrain—due to irregularity of the shape of the eyeball (astigmatism). Only a minority of us suffer any discomfort or ill effects therefrom. Of course, no exercise to which you can subject your eyes can alter the shape of your eyeballs, any more than exercise can alter the shape of your head. Rest, rather than exercise, is called for when one suffers from eyestrain—that is, avoiding all near work, and getting out in the open where you look only at distant things. The very trouble in eyestrain is that the faulty shape of the eyeball renders the refraction of light more difficult unless unusual effort is made by the eye, which means the expenditure of energy to an excessive degree.

BOLSHEVISM DYING,

SAYS W. M. CHANDLER

Member of the House Saw Many Signs of Reviving of Business on European Trip.

New York, April 17.—Bolshevism is dying in Europe in the opinion of Representative Walter M. Chandler of the Holland-American Line. He praised the work of the Red Cross and other relief organizations operating on the continent.

"From outward appearances I found affairs about the same as when I went abroad two years ago," said Mr. Chandler. "I found the same depressed currency, the same poverty, misery, commercial stagnation and industrial paralysis. The scars of war are still visible and the graves of the dead are ever present."

"But in the face of all this there are unmistakable signs of improvement, and the dawning of a better day undoubtedly is at hand. The signs of approaching regeneration are more spiritual and intellectual than tangible and material. The great and hopeful sign is the prospect of an early dissolution and disappearance of Bolshevism in its radical form. Leningrad, the high priest, has pronounced the end of ceremonies, and the world is saying amen and joining in the doxology."

"I do not mean to say that radicalism of a dangerous character has passed out, but I do mean to say that Bolshevism of the radical form of two years ago is dead and all good men will rejoice at the thought."

"At various times and places in my travels I remarked the failure of radical propaganda. I was in Paris during the recent by-election for members of the Chamber of Deputies and witnessed the rout of the Red forces and the triumph of the friends of law and order."

"From the galleries of the German Reichstag I listened to the speech of a radical Socialist who loudly proclaimed the doctrine of Bolshevism, but noted with satisfaction that his remarks were greeted by no considerable applause."

"At Reval, about a month ago, the Estonians celebrated the third anniversary of their independence. Parades were the order of the day. The Russian Reds tried to organize a counter-demonstration, but were promptly suppressed by the police of the brave little republic that has refused from the beginning to have anything to do with Bolshevism."

"Again, while I was in London, I witnessed a most interesting proceeding at the foot of Nelson's monument in Trafalgar Square. An amateur orator waved a red flag and harangued a big crowd for more than thirty minutes. Only shouts of denunciation and derision greeted his remarks. When I suggested to a policeman that the meeting

WOUNDED BY BOMB

DUBLIN, April 17.—P. J. Kelley, correspondent here of the New York World, was wounded in an ambush at the O'Connell Bridge, in the heart of the business district of Dublin last night.

Kelley, with two other newspaper correspondents, had just crossed the bridge and they stepped back to avoid it. The automobile is supposed to have contained members of the crown forces, as it was immediately attacked with a bomb. The other correspondents dropped to the ground and a bomb splinter in the face which tore his cheek. He will be operated on Monday for removal of the splinter.

Other bomb explosions followed the first one, and there was revolver fire. So far as known, however, there was no one injured but Kelley.

MAY PURCHASE FACTORY FOR TECHNICAL SCHOOL

GUELPH, April 17.—The board of education at a special meeting Saturday night instructed the advisory industrial commission to further consider the proposition to purchase an empty factory building on Paisley street for the sum of \$12,000 to be used as a new technical school. Several members of the board were of the opinion that a new building should be constructed and that the proper site for such an institution should be in the present collegiate institute property.

TORONTO, April 16.—An opinion given by eminent counsel this morning was to the effect that Rev. Peter Bryce was wrong when he stated that every employee is entitled to two hours with pay in addition to his lunch hour in which to vote on the referendum on Monday.

The latest opinion is that the law referred to by Mr. Bryce does not apply to the referendum on Monday.
