

BAKERS RAISE THE

PRICE OF BREAD TWO CENTS A LOAF

Action Follows Conference of Woodstock Bakers On

Monday.

WOODSTOCK, June 7.—The local bakers have fallen in line with the bakers of other nearby towns, and as the result of a conference held here yesterday the price of bread is today 2 cents a loaf, an advance of two cents. A London firm today sold bread for 10 cents, but the grocer handling the bread was tonight notified that the price would advance to comply with the price charged by the local bakers.

LAUNCH CAMPAIGN AGAINST GAMBLING

Hamilton Conference Commends Action of Attorney-General Raney.

HAMILTON, June 7.—The Hamilton conference held its closing session this morning at First Methodist Church. It was resolved that a strong appeal be made to the Dominion Government with a view of putting a stop to race track gambling. The action of Attorney-General Raney was again very favorably commented upon. If the Methodist Church as a whole adopt the same policy as that taken by the Hamilton

latching a big campaign will be launched within the next few months to force the issue of gambling.

A copy of this resolution has been sent the premier with a hope that he would take a decided stand against gambling.

A Matter of Years.

The opinion of the conference seems to be divided as to whether or not the work of the co-operation committee should be carried on as usual until the situation of the union situation has practically reached a crisis. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS.

Soda and the Teeth.

Kindly tell me whether soda will injure the teeth if used only once a week in brushing them. It seems to whiten them. Please tell me what would be good for a hard place on the bottom of the foot. MISS M. W.

Answer.—The occasional use of soda will not injure the teeth. Paint the cavity once a day with a solution of 5 grains of salicylic acid in a solution of colodion. This may be had ready prepared in some drug stores under the title of salicylated colodion.

Local Anæsthetic.

What is meant by a local anæsthetic?

Answer.—Local anaesthetic is anything which removes or stops the pain sense in a local region. Sometimes hemorrhoids may be operated on with a local anaesthetic, though a general anaesthetic is more commonly used.

Sweaty Feet.

I am 18 years old, and troubled quite considerably with sweaty feet. Could you recommend anything that will prevent it?

Answer.—Stop washing your feet with warm water. Use only cold or cool water, but the more rarely they are washed the better. Freely sprinkle
