Detroit, Sept. 7 .- Forty shots were fired early this evening in a street battle between negroes and policemen, and when the smoke had cleared away one bluecoat and an unidentified negro lay dead on the roadway and another officer was in receiving hospital with a bullet in his hip. The dead policeman is Frank Marchinowski, 32 years old. His partner, Frank Dombecky, 28 years

old, is the wounded man. Marchinowski and Dombecky were patroling Michigan avenue at Golden in a department car when they saw a white man running, with a negro, brandishing a knife, pursuing him They jumped out of their car and ran toward the negro, who drew a gun and started shooting. Marchinow-ski fell to the street with two bullet

ski fell to the street with two bullet wounds in his chest.

Dombecky fired at the negro and kept running toward him. The negro's gun jammed and Dombecky grappled with him. His assailant struck the officer on the head with the butt of the pistol, but Dombecky succeeded in wrenching the weapon away from him. Dombecky fired twice and the negro dropped. He died as the policeman was telephoning for the police flier.




