BAD COLLISION ON I. C. R. IN QUEBEC

QUEBEC, Jan. 13.—A serious accident occurred on the Intercolonial railway at an early hour this morning in which some twenty passengers were injured, as well as a number of the cars. The accident happened at St. Michel Station and was due to a rear collision in which a heavy freight train collided with the market train from Riviere du Loup bound for Leves, but which at the time was pulled up at St. Michel station.

The market train was composed of three cars: one first class, one second class and a mail car, and having passed the freight train at St. Michel where it was overtaken by the freight and then the collision occurred.

The three cars of the market train were smashed to pieces and most of the passengers were badly shaken up and received minor injuries but it is nothing short of miraculous from the way the cars were damaged that no lives were lost.

The freight train which was very heavily loaded, was in no way damaged by the impact.

The market train was in charge of conductor George Soule, of Riviere du Loup, while the mail car was in charge of Conductor Joe Duquay, both of whom were slightly injured.
