

sembled to meet their Royal Highnesses. The Royal visitors arrived at 2.45, and conveyed to the band stand, where an address was presented by Mayor Short, to which His Royal Highness replied briefly. An auto ride around town, to the accompaniment of great enthusiasm by the populace, concluded the functions in Nova Scotia, and the Royal party boarded the Earl Grey at the Government pier and sailed at 4.15 p.m. for St. John.
